	<p>Your project for this week is to select a town in any county in Munster. Research this town and write a report about the town. Your report should take the form of a <b><u>BROCHURE/INFORMATION BOOKLET</u></b> advertising the town.</p> <p>Remember to use very positive words and phrases as you are trying to <u>encourage</u> and <u>persuade</u> people to visit the town.</p> <p>You can include some or all of the following points;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Location of the town (include a map if possible) – where in the county? How to get there? Is there a train station?</li> <li>- Geography of the area, local rivers, lakes, mountains, - is there a river/bridge in the town?</li> <li>- History of the town – is it a Norman settlement, is there a castle nearby? Can you find old photographs of the town?</li> <li>- Tourist sites – castles, parks, caves, old buildings, museums, exhibitions</li> <li>- Things to do (for adults and children) – water activities, playgrounds, walks and trails, cycle tracks</li> <li>- Entertainment – theatres, fairy trails, festivals, street markets or performances</li> <li>- Where to stay – hotels, hostels, camp sites, B&amp;Bs</li> <li>- Places to eat – is there a wide choice of restaurants presenting a vast and varied selection of food</li> <li>- Another other interesting facts about the town</li> </ul> <p>After you’ve done a draft and edited it, the final publication should have a clear layout, be easy to read and be eye-catching</p> <p><b><u>Resources – where to find the information</u></b></p> <p><b>Geography Quest</b> Chapter 11 <b>Tourism</b>.
