

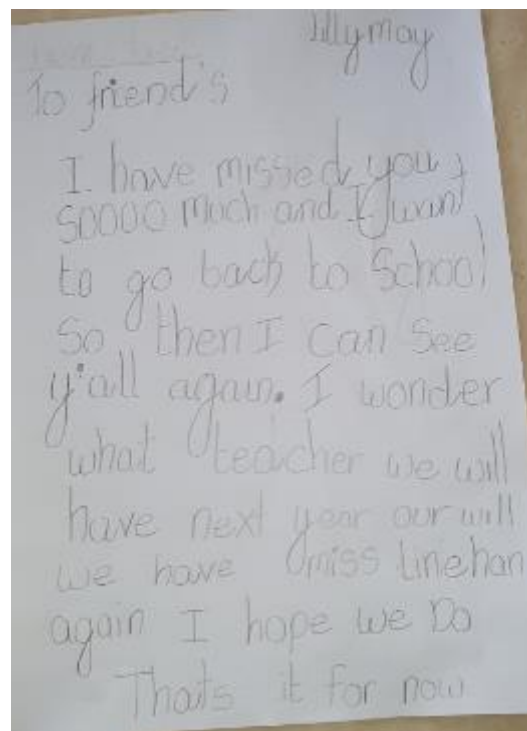
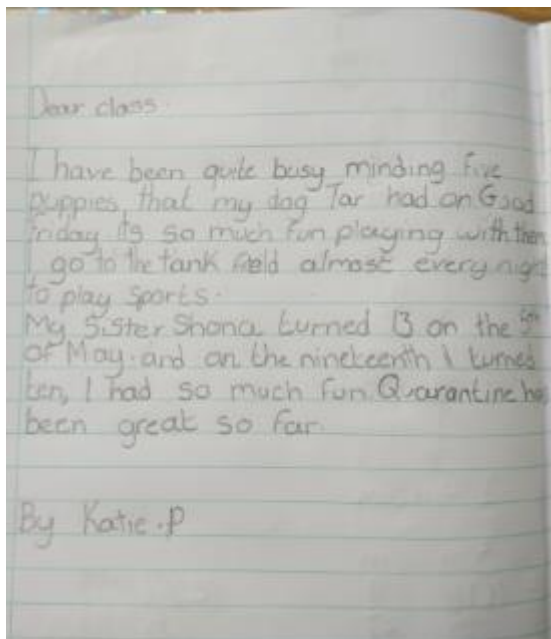
Dear Parents and Girls,
